The Chapin American Legion Rider "team" is (currently) the only "live" team on our STACK TEAM webpage. Once you provide a password, you should be allowed to log into our webpage. When you select the "Chapin American Legion Riders" from the seven listed teams, then select "Schedule". All current Rider events and events we may participate in will then be visible. You are then able to review the event and RSVP to the event. Currently we all are LOW on the

learning curve in the utilization of the app, so there will be challenges. Those who have begun to utilize the app, seem to be enjoying the simplicity and potential of the app. When you have questions, we will do our best to provide answers.

Your Riders Executive Committee is excited to do even more this coming year. We'll be running our ride events to enable as many of our Riders to attain/earn the (coveted) ALRSC United shoulder patch. A goal is to standardize our Rider SOP and our Ride Captain Ride Safety Briefings. We plan to inculcate Ride & Rider Safety at every Rider meeting. 


A few of our ALR Chapter 193 members rode out to Missouri to participate in a Regional ROMP event
