From the saddle of my Goldwing

December is usually one of our "biggest" months, even though, our rides fade after the ides of December. This year is no exception.

The boxes you see at the post: Toys for Tots Box, Newberry Boys Farm Box and the Dorn VA Christmas Box are all there to give our Legionaries the opportunity to reach out and help our neighbors.

On December 7th we participate in our first Christmas Charity Ride of the season, the Blue Knights/Toys for Tots Ride. Your Riders will rally at the Sportsman's Warehouse, to ride together to the staging area, the SC Military Museum. At the SC Military Museum there will be riders from multiple Legion Rider Posts, SC Patriot Guard Riders, Blue Knights, Combat Vets and a plethora of motorcycle riding clubs and groups. At 1300 the several hundred motorcycles, Can-Ams and Trikes, under a police safety escort, head out to the Colonial Life Insurance campus with the toys.

On December 13th your Riders lead the Richard Strobel Memorial Wreaths Across America Escort Ride. This ride, named after Past Post Commander Richard Stroble, was begun following his passing. Richard's trucking company under Richard's leadership began supporting the Wreaths Across America years ago. Today, on this ride, we meet up with a several Wreaths Across America tractor trailers loaded with several thousand Christmas wreaths for the Fort Jackson National Cemetery (FJNC). Post 193 leads this escort, accompanied by several other Post's Legion Riders, and members of the SC Patriot Guard Riders. We escort the trucks to the FJNC, where we are met by hundreds of volunteers who will distribute the wreaths.

Following the escort, Post 193's riders turn and ride straight back to Chapin to prepare and execute Chapin's own Wreaths Across America ceremony and distribution at five Chapin Church cemeteries. This Chapin Wreaths Across America effort is led by our Adjutant, Steve Goulet.

Following the Chapin Wreaths Across America events, your Riders ride to Boland's Ace Hardware to lead the Newberry Boys Farm Toy Ride. We line up, right behind the parade "lead" the Newberry antique fire engine, upon which Mr. & Mrs. Clause ride to lead the motorcycle procession. This ride normally has several hundred motorcycles for this 17-mile ride/parade up US 76W. Upon arrival at the Newberry Shriner building, the toys are unloaded and distributed.

Our final Christmas charity ride is our participation in the 25th Anniversary Annual Dorn VA Hospital Christmas Ride. This ride differs from the others, as this one supports veterans at the VA hospital with items that the veterans need. Your riders will again rally at the Sportsman's Warehouse for a ride to the Carolina Honda Powerhouse to stage for the ride. through Columbia to the Dorn VA Hospital. At the VA Hospital, the gifts are unloaded and placed under their giant tree for distribution.

And, if that wasn't enough, our quarterly Interment of Previously Unclaimed Veterans will occur on Friday December 12th at FJNC. You Riders and SC Patriot Guard Riders escort the remains to FJNC.

Prior to the escort and interment your Riders will participate in what we call the "Dignified Transfer of Remains". The County Coroners of Berkeley and Horry County have identified four unclaimed veterans. Your riders will meet with Riders from Conway on Tuesday December 2nd in Sumter for the dignified transfer. On Wednesday December 3rd your riders will meet with Riders from Goose Creek in Blackville for the dignified transfer. We will then bring the remains to our Post in Chapin.

We encourage all Post 193 members attend the Interment of Previously Unclaimed Veterans, at FJNC at 1100 on Friday December 12th.
