This past Thursday morning, September 18th, Eight Chapin American Legion Riders joined American Legion Riders from multiple South Carolina Posts rode to Washington DC. This is our annual volunteer mission with the National Park System to "Wash the Wall", the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. The US Park Service schedules our Riders, alternatively between "the Wall" and the Korean War Memorial.

On Friday, September 19th, which was National POW/MIA Recognition Day, some of our Riders toured DC, including Arlington National Cemetery and view the "Changing of the Guard" at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. One SC Post was honored to place a Wreath there.

The rest of our Legion Riders made a stop at the National D-Day Memorial in Bedford, VA. Bedford is a small town in Virginia that proportionally lost more young men in the D-Day Landing than any other city or town in America. Our tour guide made the visit extremely memorable.

On Saturday September 20th, at 0530, 30 motorcycles and several "cages" rode up I-95N towards the Mall of Washington. This was an "exciting" (in a Tom Clancy kind of way) ride, as traffic into and out of our Nation's Capital is always "rush hour". We arrived at 0600, just before dawn.

At the Vietnam Memorial we were met by a familiar Park Ranger who has meet us the last several years. He briefed our large group, provided washing instructions and provided the washing tools and supplies. We were able to accomplish our mission by about 0830, prior to the Memorials opening at 0900.

We American Legion Riders of South Carolina were joined by two SC Girl Scout Troops; Troop 626 and Troop 3327 from Pelion, SC. They joined us in our wall washing, and were able to learn about the "Wall" from our veterans.

This annual endeavor by SC American Legion Riders is a moving and inspirational event in which we are proud to participate.

Welcome new members, we're glad you've chosen to join us. Thank you for the privilege of being your service office! There are several changes with the Veterans administration regarding service-connected disability related to Vietnam, Gulf wars, etc. Please don't hesitate to apply for service-connected disability related to your wartime service. Come see me with your questions. If you're uncertain, file the letter of intent while you seek information and talk to me. There is also a newer program called Caregiver Assistance

program which pays a spouse, child, or agency to help any veteran who is 70-100% service-connected needing help with Activities of daily living. Please see me if you'd like more information.

There's a great program for anyone with PTSD. The Reboot program has 3 courses, 1- Trauma reboot, 2-Combat reboot and 3- Emergency responder's reboot. They are a 12-week programs meeting once a week for 12 weeks. You can remain anonymous by leaving your camera off as the course is done by zoom. Whether you choose to participate in the sessions is your decision.
